About Us:

Clinton Social Services is committed to assisting residents throughout the year with basic needs. We also play a major role in helping residents gain access to and assist them with the coordination of our local, state, and federal safety net programs. Those programs include energy/fuel assistance, SNAP (food stamps) renters rebate, emergency food and shelter assistance and help with veterans issues. We also have a limited supply of clothing goods on hand as well as such things as diapers and baby formula. We work in conjunction with Clinton Youth and Family Services for families with minor children.
